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
SEPTEMBER 2014

Overview

Government operations for the September quarter 2014/15 resulted in a deficit (Net Borrowing) of \$11.2 million. This was largely due to operating expense exceeding revenue by \$5.8 million coupled with the purchase of non financial assets of \$5.3 million.

When compared to September 2013, overall balance improved by \$8.1 million when the deficit was at \$19.3 million. The year-on-year improvement in the quarter outturn was largely due to total expenditure (current expense *plus* acquisition of assets) being contained at \$16.0 million or 10.7 percent lower than the corresponding period 2013. Shown in Chart 1 is the notable improvement in the balance for the period under review compared to September quarter as well as the previous quarter.

Chart 1: Net Operating Balance and Net Lending /Borrowing as % of GDP



The Net Borrowing amount of \$11.2 million was fully financed by a drawdown of \$12.0 million from the banking system. In GDP terms, Net Lending/Borrowing was equivalent to 2.3 percent.

Revenues:


Total Revenue for September quarter 2014 amounted to \$121.7 million. This was a decrease of 6.1 percent or \$7.9 million from September 2013 level. The shortfall in revenue was primarily due to less cash grants received in September 2014 compared to 2013 couple with a shortfall of \$1.5 million in other revenues.

Tax revenue collection recorded a slight increase \$0.4 million when compared to the September quarter 2013, and \$0.3 million compared to June quarter 2014. At this level tax revenue grew at a quarterly trend growth of 0.8 percent over the period of three years ending September 2014. The increase was due mainly to increases of \$2.5 million, \$2.2 million and 1.9 million in VAGST, Custom and import duties and income tax, which more than offset a drop of \$5.9 million in excise tax for the comparable period.

Other revenues including property income and administrative fees with a combined collection of \$8.9 million were also short by \$1.2 million in the period under review. Grants received in the September quarter 2014/15 was \$0.9 million.

Details of revenues by type are provided in Table 2 attached.

Expense by type:

Total Government Expenditure for the review period amounted to \$132.9 million. This represents an increase of \$3.3 million or 2.5 percent over the level of September 2013. Of the total amount, \$127.6 million (96.0 percent) were operating expenses and \$5.3 million was spent to acquire non financial assets needed during the period. Provided in the summary table below is the summary of expenditure by type.

The operating expense (excluding the Acquisition of NFA's) for the September 2014 went down by \$0.7 million (0.6 percent) compared to the corresponding quarter 2013. The lower level of spending for the period was due primarily to a shortfall in disbursement of grants to Public Bodies. The shortfall offset the increase in the compensation of employees and an increase in spending on goods and services of more than \$5.0 million. These increases were somewhat reflects Governments commitment in hosting the SIDS meeting during the period under review.

Expenses on the *acquisition of non-financial assets* (fixed assets) amounted to \$5.3 million for the September quarter. The amount was \$15.3 million (74.1 percent) lower than the September 2013 level and was \$70.0 million (92.9 percent) below June 2014. This reflects the tailoring off of some of the infrastructural works in preparations for hosting the SIDS meeting in recent periods.

Presented in the Table is the composition of government expenditure for the September quarter 2014 which saw General Public Services share of 31.1 percent, a total amount of \$41.4 million. When compared to September 2013, expense increased by 24.3 percent. The increase was due primarily to the cost needed for various services provided for hosting of the SIDS 2014 meeting in Samoa in late August early September 2014.


Other sectors with large shares of the total expenditure like Health, Education and Economic Services are in line with the Government priority sectors stipulated in the Samoa Strategy for the Development of Samoa 2013—2016. Table 5 provides the details and time series of the Government Expenditure by function.

Government Debt:

Total Government outstanding Debt reached \$1.04 billion as at the end of September 2014. External debt amounted to \$984.8 million, and Domestic debt stood at \$50.8 million, as presented in Table 6 attached. The total debt amount went up slightly by 2.0 percent when compared to the end June 2014 level. Illustrated in the chart below is the composition of debt level over the last ten quarters.

External Borrowings through multilateral (international organisations) amount to \$545.9 million, 0.4 percent less than what was recorded in June 14. Disbursements from Bilateral agreements (foreign government) stood at \$438.9 million, 4.9 percent higher than June 14 period, reflecting an ongoing infrastructural projects particularly for the Health and Education sectors.

Chart 6: Samoa's External and Domestic Debt stock as of September 2014



Domestic Debt position as at the end of September 2014 registered an increase of 2.0 percent compared June 2014 quarter. Domestic debt stood at \$50.8 million, and comprised 4.9 percent of total Government debt.

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What are Government Finance Statistics?

Government Finance Statistics provide statistics that enable policymakers and analysts to study developments in the financial operations, financial position and liquidity situation of the government sector in a consistent and systematic manner. Balancing items have been created to provide summary information such as Net Operating Balance (NOB) and Net Lending (+) or Borrowing (-). The detailed data can also be used to examine specific areas of government operations, example: particular forms of taxation, level of expense and the amount of government borrowing etc. The harmonization of this system with other macroeconomic statistical systems like the System of National Accounts means that data from the GFS can be combined with data from NA to assess government performance in relation to the rest of the economy. Similarly, it can also be used for inter-country analysis of government operations, such as comparisons of ratios of taxes or expense to gross domestic product.

This publication is the eighth release of Government Finance Statistics compiled using the GFS 2001 Manual. Changes include: changes to coverage; reclassification of revenue and expense items; compilation of data government acquisition of debt and assets (such as buildings and infrastructure); and new analytical balances. It provides detail information on revenues and expenses on a quarterly basis. Provided in this publication also is the Expenditure classified by Function of Government (COFOG) data set. This is one of the developments that the Bureau has been working on in-conjunction with the Ministry of Finance with the technical assistance provided by the IMF Expert. This dataset adds more information in monitoring and evaluating progress of the Government Sector, as well as its contribution to various sectors of the economy.

GFS New Developments

Work is continuing in extending the coverage to include the public bodies detail information enabling the General Government sector to be published in the near future
