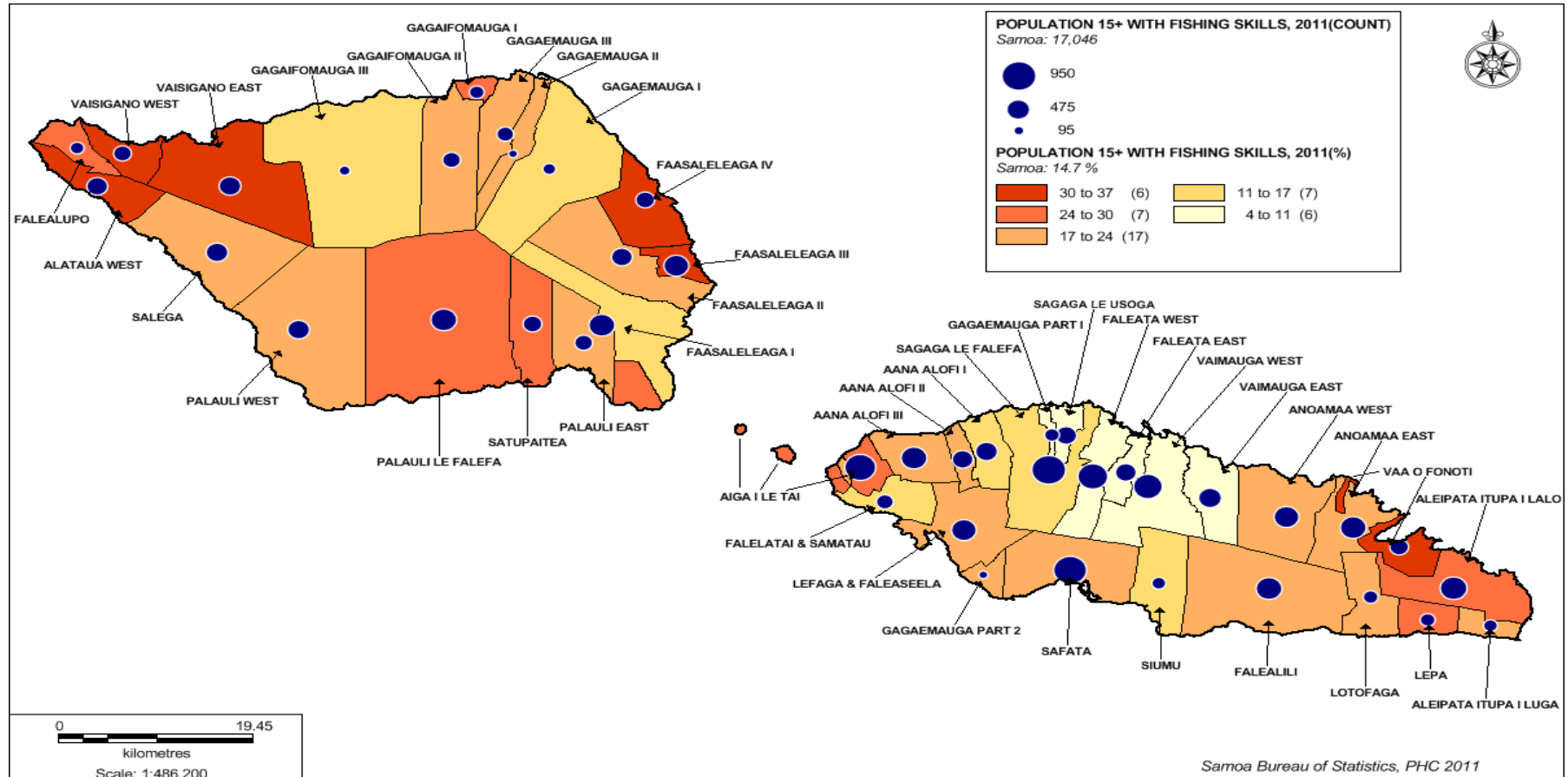




# POPULATION WITH SKILLS IN FISHING BY POLITICAL DISTRICTS, 2011



Out of **187,820** persons recorded in the Census 2011, about **115,900** people were those in the working age of **15 years and over**. Out of the 115,900 working population, **15 percent or 17,046** persons were those with **skills in fishing**. The map above shows the distribution of the population with fishing skills by political districts using **two keys**.

The **first** one uses the **circle shapes** to explain the **actual numbers** of people with fishing skills in each political district. The biggest and the medium circles explains the range of **475-950** people with fishing skills in some districts. For example, the biggest circles on the political district of

**Sagaga le Falefa** and others explain that the population of people with fishing skills in those district ranges from **475 to 950** persons. On the other hand the smallest circle on the District of **Gagaifomauga III** and others tells the range of **0-95** people with fishing skills stayed there.

The **second** key uses **colours** to identify the **percentage** of people with skills in fishing when compared to the whole population of each district. The **first colour red** tells that **6 political districts** have the **highest percentage** of the population with skills in fishing ranging from **30 to 37 percent** while the **last colour light yellow** shows **6 political districts** with the **lowest percentage** ranging from **4 to 11 percent**.

Overall, out of the total population with skills in fishing which is 17,046, **64 percent or 10,929** people lived on Upolu Island *including (Manono and Apolima)* but **36 percent or 6,117** people lived on the island of Savaii.
