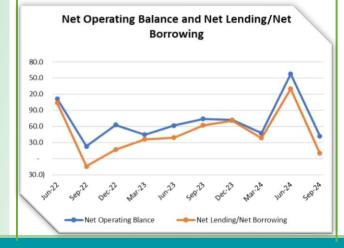




Government finance statistics for Budgetary Central Government recorded a net operating surplus of \$41.9 million for the September 2024 quarter, \$32.2 million lower when compared to the same period of 2023. Total operating expenses (excluding the Net Acquisition of Fixed Assets) stood at \$197.3 million, recording an increase of \$23.5 million from the September 2023 quarter. Revenue collected for the period under review recorded a total of \$239.2 million which was more than enough to offset the increase in spending.

The overall balance (Net lending/ Net borrowing) recorded a surplus of \$9.9 million, down by \$52.2 million registering an 84.0% decrease on an annual basis. Contributing to the decline, total expenditures of \$229.3 million increased by \$43.5 million for the reviewed period was translated into a 23.4% increase on a year-on-year basis. As a result, the banking system (Net Acquisition of financial Asset) reported a drawdown of \$18.1 million in the September 2024 quarter.

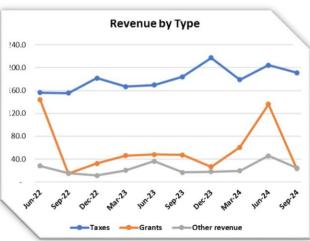
Chart 1: Net Operating Balance & Net Lending / **Borrowing Balance**



Revenue

Revenue collected for the quarter under review stood at \$239.2 million, down by \$8.7 million from the amount recorded in the same quarter of 2023. Taxation revenue was the biggest contributor with \$191.1 million, accounting for 79.9% of total revenue. Grants received during the quarter amounted to \$23.3 million and other revenue collected \$24.8 million, accounting for 9.7% and 10.3% respectively. The chart below shows the trends of the three types of revenue.

Chart 2: Revenue by Type Sep 2022 - Sep 2024

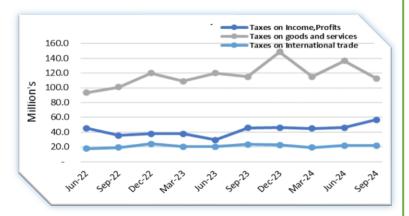


Taxes

Taxes collected within the September 2024 quarter amounted to \$191.1 million, an increase of \$6.9 million (or 3.8 percent) over the September 2023 quarter. This was largely driven by taxes on income, profits, and capital gains, aggregating to \$56.7 million and accounting for 29.6% of overall taxes.

Taxes on goods and services went down by 2.3 million (2.0%) recording a total of \$112.7 million compared to September 2023. Foreign trade taxes also dropped by \$1.7 million (7.3%) accumulating a quarterly balance of \$21.8 million as of September 2024. Both taxation categories results were not able to undermine a positive tax collection.

Grants

Total Grants received from foreign government and donors stood at \$23.3 million, a decrease of \$23.8 million (or 50.5 percent) compared to September 2023 quarter. This amount has dropped by \$132.9 million (or 82.9 percent) compared to the previous quarter of June 2024.

Other Revenues

Other Revenue for the reviewed quarter September 2024 was \$24.8 million, which was \$8.2 million (or 49.3 percent) more than what was recorded in the same quarter of 2023. During the review, sales of goods and services, Property income and Fines, penalties, and forfeits amount to \$15.9 million, \$7.4 million and \$1.5 million respectively. More detail attached in table 2.

Expenditure by Type

Government Expenditures for the September 2024 quarter amounted to \$229.3 million, an increase of \$43.5 million (or 23.4%) compared to the September 2023 quarter. Operating expenses was at \$197.3 million while net acquisition of nonfinancial assets amounted to \$31.9 million.

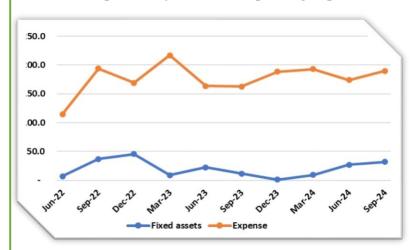

Operating expenses for the September 2024 quarter amounted to \$197.3 million increasing by 13.5 percent (or \$23.5 million) compared to the September 2023 quarter. Of this amount, 41.3 percent were for Compensation of employees, 25.6 percent were government grants to public corporations, 26.3 percent for use of goods and services and 3.5 percent to social benefits and the remaining 3.2 percent were on Interests, Other expenses and subsidies.

Total commitments by the Budgetary Central Government during the first quarter of the fiscal year 23/24 went up due to the increase in Compensation of employees, use of goods and services, Grants to Public bodies and subsidies by \$15.6 million, \$8.3 million, \$2.4 million and \$0.1 million respectively. Other components such as social benefits, interest and other expenses record slight decreases of \$2.2 million, \$0.7 million and \$0.1 million correspondingly.

Expenditure by COFOG

The Classification of Function of Government (COFOG) is classified as the distribution of government expenditure per sector of the economy. The total COFOG for the quarter of September 2024 amounted to \$229.3 million, representing a decrease of \$43.5 million or 23.4 percent from its corresponding 2023 quarter.

The General Public services sector received \$53.6 million in September 2023. These expenses are administered and accounted by the corporate services of a few government ministries. The Economic Affairs category received a total share of \$43.7 million. The Economic Affairs category contains almost all major economic sectors such as agriculture and fishing, energy, manufacturing, infrastructure, transportation, and communication.

Furthermore, the Government provided and lend a total of \$38.1 mi The share has increased by \$3.8 million from the previous year and thus equivalent to 16.6 percent of total COFOG. In September 2024, the education sector generated a total of \$34.1 million, an increase of \$7.7 million (29.3 percent) over its corresponding quarter of 2023. The chart below shows the composition of government expenditure by function of government.

Government Deht

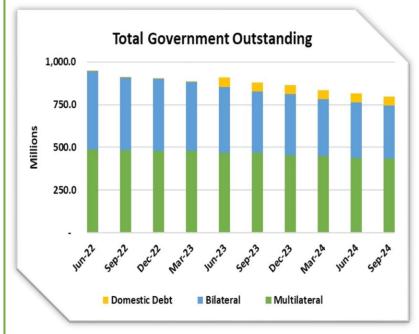
Government debt as at the end of September 2024 totalled at \$796.0 million, comprised of external debt (\$743.0 million) and domestic loans (\$52.9 million). Total debt decreased by \$84.9 million over the same period of 2023,

The amount owed to international financial institutions through multilateral agreements was \$434.4 million. The largest lender was the World Bank with total loans of \$256.9 million, \$158.6 million was the amount owed to the Asian Development Bank, \$14.5 million are loans to the OPEC and \$2.1 million are total loans to the European Investment Bank and the FAO. At the aggregated level, total loans to international institutions dropped by \$32.3 million from September 2023.

On the other hand, the Government of Samoa owed the PRC \$254.8 million and the Japanese Government \$52.8 million. These loans were granted based on bilateral agreements between the Government of Samoa and the two countries. The total bilateral loans were \$50.6 million lower from its standing amount in September 2023. The external debt had gone down by \$82.9 million over the last twelve months period.

On the contrary, domestic loans increased amounted to \$1.9 million as at the ending of the September 2024 quarter. The growth of the three types of instruments is shown in the chart below.

The detailed data can also be used to examine specific areas of government operations, example: particular forms of taxation, level of expense and the amount of government borrowing etc. The harmonization of this system with other macroeconomic statistical systems like the System of National Accounts means that data from the GFS can be combined with data from NA to assess government performance in relation to the rest of the economy. Similarly, it can also be used for inter-country analysis of government operations, such as comparisons of ratios of taxes or expense to gross domestic product.

The Bureau is continuing with the work on refinements and improvements to the framework ensuring compliance with the latest GFSM 2014 published by the IMF. This also ensure that the latest information is incorporated in the system and reflected in the report.
