Highlights of the month

October 2024 compared with September 2024

Merchandise Exports¹

- ❖ The total value of exports in October 2024 increased significantly by \$20.4 million to \$31.8 million. This increase was due to the increase in exports and re-exports of:
 - ❖ Electrical machinery & equipment products (up \$25.7 million)
 - ❖ Iron and steel products (up \$0.3 million)
 - ❖ Wood and articles of wood products (up \$0.2 million)
 - ❖ Vegetables and certain roots and tubers products (up \$0.1 million)
- ❖ Exports to Asia, valued at \$27.4 million, represented 86.4 percent of total exports during the review period, reflecting an increase of \$26.7 million compared to the previous month.
- ❖ Exports to Singapore at \$26.9 million (up \$21.2 million), USA at \$1.3 million (up \$0.08 million) and Tokelau at \$1.2 million (up \$0.09 million), had the largest increases in October 2024, due to higher exports of fiber optic cables, timber and scrap metals and coconut cream to name a few.

Merchandise Imports

- ❖ The total value of imports in October 2024 increased by 38.2 percent (or \$37.3 million) to \$135.0 million. This was mainly driven by the increases of:
 - ❖ Meat and edible meat products (up \$7.4 million)
 - ❖ Nuclear reactors, boilers, and machinery products (up \$4.1 million)
 - ❖ Vehicles other than railway (up \$3.5 million)
 - ❖ Dairy products (up \$3.2 million)
- ❖ Imports from the Oceania region at \$70.0 million, recorded the largest increase in October 2024 (up \$23.2 million), mainly due to the increase in imports of meat, timbers and cereals from New Zealand to name a few.
- ❖ Imports from New Zealand of \$39.2 million (up \$13.5 million), Fiji of \$20.0 million (up \$11.7 million), and USA of \$13.6 million (up \$8.6 million) had the largest increases in the reviewed month due to higher imports of vehicle and parts, timber and food products such as chicken leg quarter, flour, sugar to name a few.

Trade Balance

- ❖ The total value of imports of \$135.0 million exceeded exports of \$31.8 million, resulting in a trade deficit of \$103.2 million in October 2024. The trade deficit increased by 19.5 percent compared to the previous month but fell 1.3 compared the same month last year.

 - ❖ Aano o manu fasi ma isi oloa (si'itia i le \$7.4 miliona)
 - ❖ Masini tetele faaaogaina ai le eletise ma isi mea faigaluega (si'itia i le \$4.1 miliona)
 - ❖ Taavale, vaega ma isi mea faaopopo (si'itia i le \$3.5 miliona)
 - ❖ Oloa gaosia mai le susu (si'itia i le \$3.2 miliona)
- ❖ O le itulagi o Oseania na faamauina e \$70.0 miliona le tau aofai o oloa auina mai ia Oketopa 2024 (si'itia i le \$23.2 miliona) e pei o a'ano o manu fasi, oloa fai mai i saito/saga ma laupapa mai Niu Sila.
- ❖ O le tau aofai o oloa auina mai i Niu Sila e \$39.2 miliona (si'itia i le \$13.5 miliona), Fiti e \$20.0 miliona (si'itia i le \$11.7 miliona) ma Amerika e \$13.6 miliona (si'itia i le \$8.6 miliona) na faamauina le si'itia maualuga i le masina Oketopa 2024. O nei oloa e aofia ai taavale ma ona vaega, laupapa faapea meaai e pei o moa, falaoamata, suka ma isi oloa.

Paleni o Fefa'ataua'iga

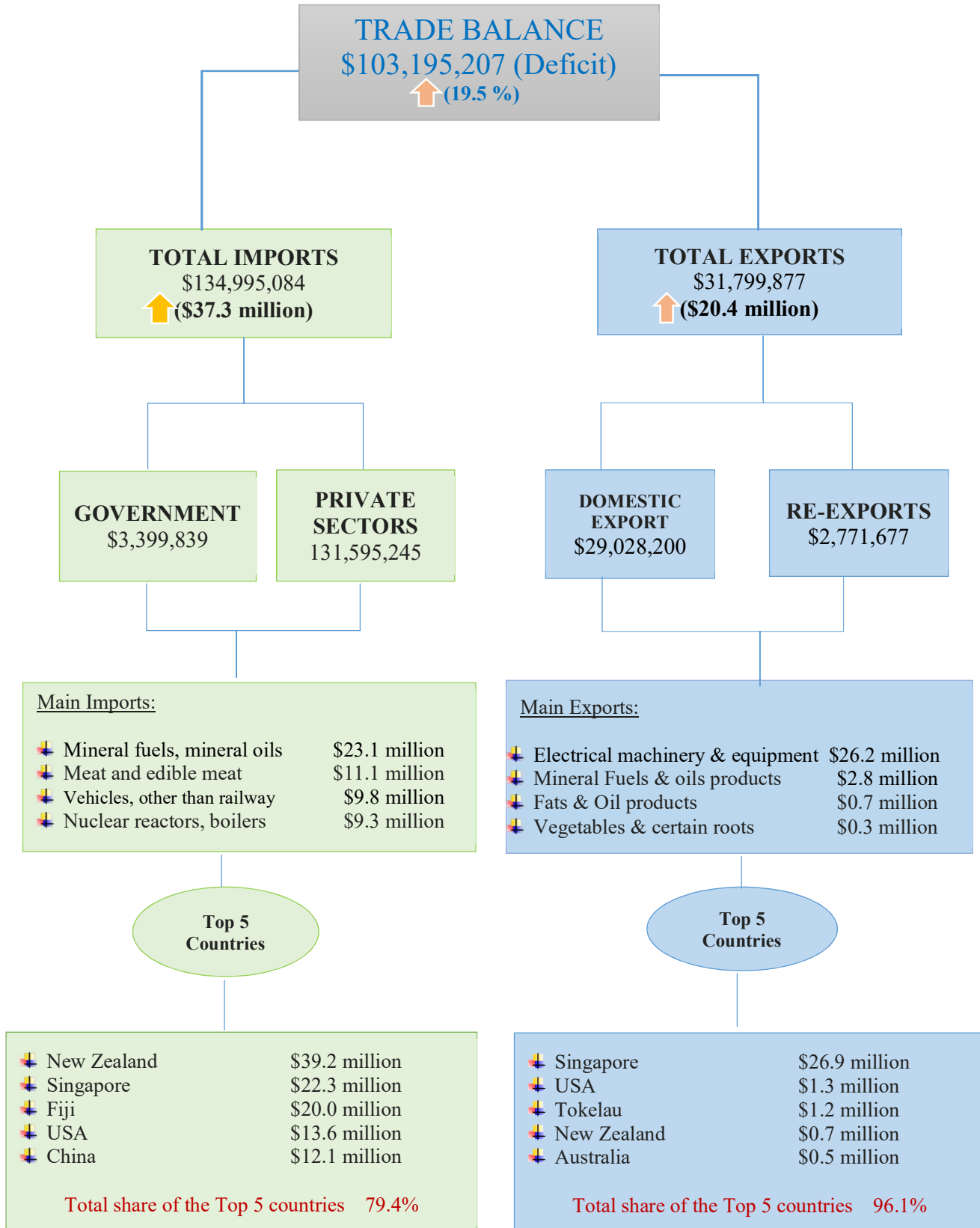

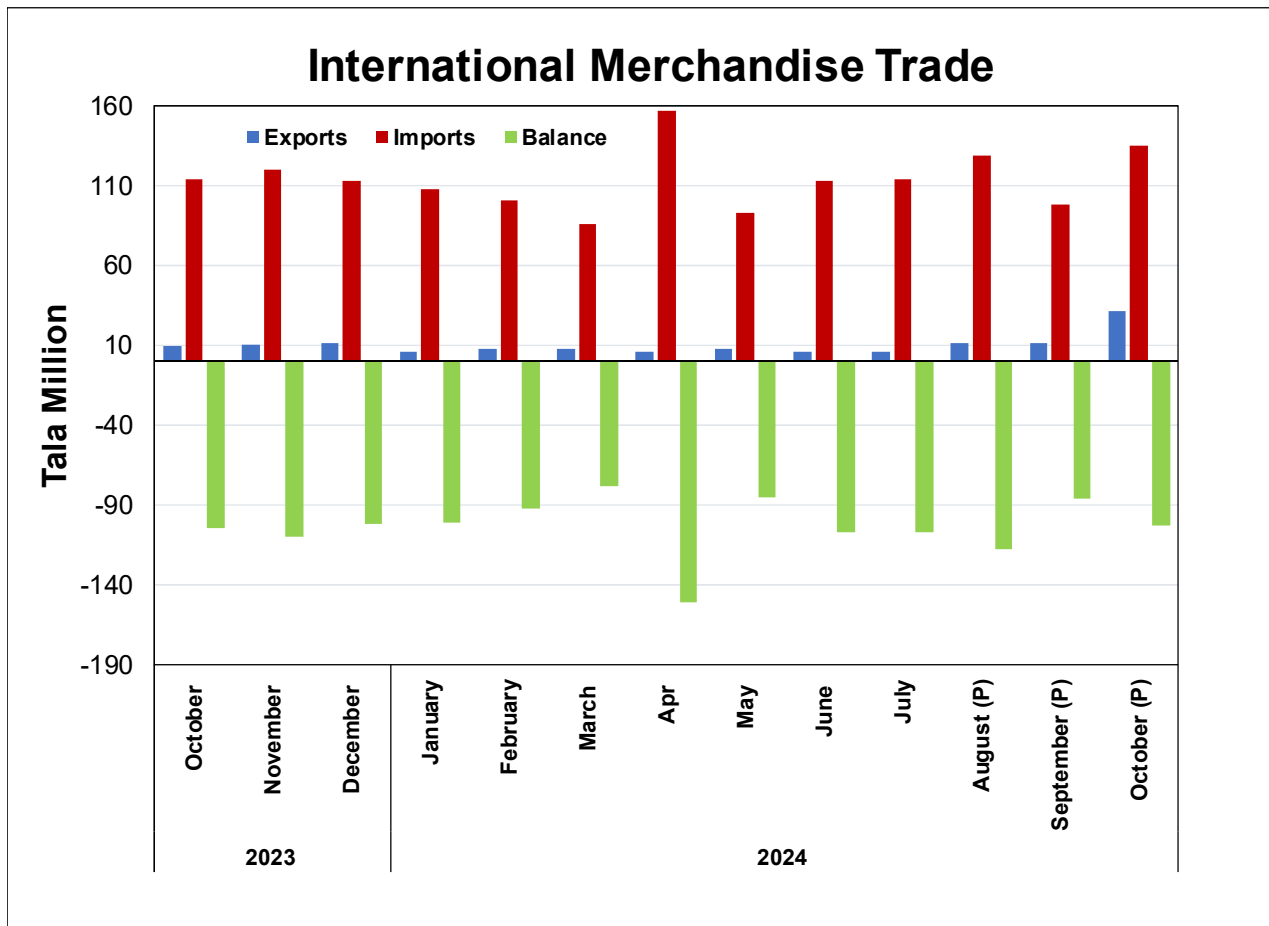

The main source of imports and exports data comes from the administrative document; a completed customs form (Single Administrative data-SAD) which is required to be filled in by importers and exporters or customs agents when clearing merchandise inward and outward through the Ministry of Customs and Revenue.
