Highlights of the month

September 2024 compared with August 2024

Merchandise Exports¹

- ❖ The total value of exports in September 2024 increased by 5.1 percent (or \$0.6 million) to \$11.4 million. This was due to the increases in the exports and re-exports of:
 - ❖ Optical fibers and cable products (up \$5.0 million)
 - ❖ Mineral fuels, mineral oils and products (up \$0.03 million)
 - ❖ Preparations of vegetables, fruit, and nuts products (up \$0.2 million)
 - ❖ Dairy products (up \$0.04 million)
- ❖ Exports to Oceania of \$9.2 million had the largest share of 80.8 percent of total exports in the period under review, increasing 78.2 percent compared to the previous month.
- ❖ Exports to Singapore of \$5.7 million (up \$1.7 million), New Zealand of \$1.9 million (up \$0.09 million) and Tokelau of \$1.1 million (up \$0.02 million) had the largest increases in September 2024, mainly due to higher exports of fiber optic cables, coconut oil and milk to name a few.

Merchandise Imports

- ❖ The total value of imports in September 2024 fell 24.2 percent (or \$31.2 million) to \$97.7 million. This was mainly driven by the decreases of:
 - ❖ Mineral fuels, mineral oils and products (down \$4.4 million)
 - ❖ Vehicles other than railway (down \$4.5 million)
 - ❖ Electrical machinery and equipment products (down \$7.2 million)
 - ❖ Nuclear reactors, boilers, machinery and products (down \$4.2 million)
- ❖ Imports from the Oceania region at \$46.8 million, recorded the largest decrease in September 2024 (down \$16.0 million), mainly due to the reduction in the imports of meat, wood and cereals from New Zealand, to name a few.
- ❖ Imports from New Zealand of \$25.7 million (down \$10.8 million), Singapore of \$24.9 million (down \$4.8 million), and Australia of \$11.1 million (down \$3.9 million) had the largest decreases in the reviewed month as a result of lower imports of petroleum products, vehicle and parts and food products such sugar, flour and chicken leg quarter, to name a few.

Trade Balance

- ❖ The total value of imports of \$97.7 million exceeded exports of \$11.4 million, resulting in a trade deficit of \$86.3 million in September 2024. The trade deficit decreased by 26.9 percent and 16.7 percent when compared to its balance in the previous month and the same month last year respectively.




