# LOCAL MARKET SURVEY MAY 2023

This report provides a monthly review of selected agricultural produce available at the Local Markets in Upolu and Savaii based on the price data and volume index survey. Corresponding tables are attached for ease of reference.

## **Key findings:**


The Local Market Survey in May 2023 showed that the overall supply decreased by 17 percent while the overall price rose 1 percent when compared to April 2023.

- Significant reduction in the supply of pumpkin and banana led to the overall decline in the volume index.
- The total value of supply decreased 3 percent to \$78,200 from the previous month.
- The total number of sellers fell 4 percent to 189 in May 2023 from the 198 recorded in April 2023.

#### **OVERVIEW**


The monthly survey of Agricultural food supplies at the local markets by the Samoa Bureau of Statistics in May 2023 showed that overall volume decreased 17 percent from April 2023. This was due to the decline in the supply of pumpkin, banana and yam to the markets. When compared to May 2022, current supply also fell 24 percent. (See Graph 1 and Tables 4 & 5)



The overall price index rose 1 percent from the previous month and further went up 52 percent when compared to May 2022.

#### **TARO**

At 4,813 kilograms, the supply of taro increased 4 percent from the previous month, while its average price increased by 2 percent (to \$4.14 per kilogram). When compared to May 2022, the supply of taro fell 14 percent while its average price increased 24 percent. (See Graph 2 and Tables 1&2)




Taro supply increased by 2 percent in the twelvemonth period ending May 2023 in comparison to the twelve-month period ending May 2022. Its price also increased 33 percent.

# **BANANA**


The supply of banana to the local markets in May fell 7 percent (to 1,311 kilograms) from April 2023 while its average price went up by 15 percent (to \$1.86 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply of banana fell 30 percent while its average price increased 31 percent. (See Graph 3 and Tables 1&2).



Annually, banana supplies decreased 4 percent compared to the year ended May 2022 while its average price increased 23 percent.

# TA'AMU

At an average of 44 kilograms, ta'amu supply in May 2023 was more than seven times higher than its supply in the previous month while increased supply at the markets pushed its average price down by 37 percent (to \$12.74 per kilogram). In comparison to the same month last year current supply of ta'amu fell 27 percent while its average price went up by 48 percent. (See Graph 4 and Tables 1&2)




In the year ending May 2023, volume of ta'amu supplied to the markets decreased 32 percent while its price increased more than two times in

comparison to its supply and price in the year ending May 2022.

# **COCONUT**


Coconut supply at 3,845 kilograms increased 9 percent from April 2023 while its average price remained unchanged. In comparison to May 2022, current supply of coconut fell 12 percent while its average price increased by 8 percent. (See Graph 5 and Tables 1&2)



In the twelve months ending May 2023, supply of coconut was 4 percent lower while its average price rose 8 percent when compared to the twelve months ending May 2022.

#### **BREADFRUIT**


The supply and price of breadfruit in May 2023 increased 86 percent (to 1,195 kilograms) and 48 percent (to \$3.07 per kilogram) from the previous month respectively. When compared to May 2022, current supply of breadfruit revealed no change while its average price rose 44 percent. (See Graph 6 and Tables 1&2)



Annually, supply of breadfruit fell 12 percent while its average price has more than doubled over the year ended May 2022.

# **YAM**


Yam supply at 81 kilograms decreased 8 percent from the previous month while its average price increased by 36 percent (to \$7.61 per kilogram). When compared with the same month last year, current supply of yam was 20 percent lower while its average price increased by 63 percent. (See Graph 7 and Tables 1 & 2)





Supply of yam in the twelve months ending May 2023 increased 23 percent in comparison to the twelve months ending May 2022. Its average price rose 32 percent.


# **VEGETABLE PRODUCE**


Most of the of vegetable produce supplied to the local markets increased in May 2023 with the exception of pumpkin which dropped 56 percent (to 3,523 kilograms) from the previous month. Cucumber registered the largest increase of 77 percent (to 1,535 kilograms), followed by Chinese cabbage increasing 69 percent (to 296 kilograms) and head cabbage increasing 51 percent (to 753 kilograms). Tomato supply also rose 34 percent (to 174 kilograms) when compared to the previous month. (See Graphs 8 to 12 and Tables 1 & 2)













Despite the increase in the supply of most of vegetable produce to the local markets in the month under review, strong domestic demand pushed average prices up for both tomato and cucumber; recording increases of 13 percent (to \$28.25 per kilogram) and 11 percent (to \$7.85 per kilogram) respectively. However limited pumpkin supply led to the 21 percent increase in price (to \$5.41 per kilogram). Average price for head cabbage decreased 9 percent (to \$15.41 per kilogram) and Chinese cabbage average price also went down by 4 percent (to \$10.30 per kilogram) when compared to May 2022.

## **SELLERS**

At 189, the number of sellers at the local markets on the days surveyed in May 2023 decreased by 4 percent from the previous month and down 20 percent when compared with the number of sellers in the same month a year ago. (See Graphs 13 and 14 and Table 6).





In May 2023, taro sellers at 33 were the largest group at the local markets, decreasing from the 34 in the previous month and 40 in the same month last year. Cucumber sellers followed with a total of 32 increasing from the 25 last month and 30 in the same month a year ago.


Pumpkin sellers recorded a total of 31, down from the 56 in the previous month and the 58 in the same month a year ago. The number of coconut sellers was 30, remained unchanged from the previous month but were lower than the 42 in the same month a year ago. Banana sellers recorded a total of 21, increasing from the 18 in the previous month but were lower than the 22 in the same month a year ago.

Sellers of tomato and Chinese cabbage both recorded a total of 14 each with tomato sellers increasing from the 13 in the previous month but were lower than 21 in the same month last year, while Chinese cabbage sellers increased from the 12 in April 2023 but were lower than the 19 in May 2022.

Head cabbage sellers at 10, increased from the 9 and 2 in the previous month and the same month a year ago. Breadfruit and yam sellers both recorded a total of 2; with breadfruit increasing from 1 in April 2023 and May 2022, while yam remained unchanged from the previous month but were lower than 3 in the same month a year ago. Ta'amu sellers recorded a total of 1 remaining unchanged from the previous month but were lower than the 2 in the same month a year ago.

#### VALUE OF SUPPLIES

The average value of selected produce supplied to the local markets in May 2023 stood at \$78,200, decreasing 3 percent from the previous but went up by 24 percent from May 2022.



Taro supplies contributed the most to the total value of produce supplied to the markets with a share of 25 percent in May 2023; a level that was higher than the 23 percent in the previous but were lower than the 30 percent in the same month a year ago. Pumpkin supplies followed with a 24 percent of total value, decreasing from the 44 percent in the previous month and 39 percent in the same month a year ago.

Supplies of cucumber and head cabbage both contributed 15 percent each to total value with cucumber supplies increasing from the 8 percent in the previous month and 10 percent in the same month a year ago, while head cabbage shares went up from the 11 percent in April 2023 and 2 percent in May 2022. Tomato shares rose to 6 percent from the 4 percent in the previous month but remained unchanged when compared with the same month a year ago.

Supplies of coconut and Chinese cabbage both contributed 4 percent each to total value, with coconut shares remained unchanged from last month and were lower than the 6 percent in the same month last year. Banana contributed 3 percent to total value, remaining unchanged in the previous month but were lower than 4 percent in the same month last year. Yam, breadfruit and ta'amu all contributed 1 percent each to the total value in the month under review. (See Graph 15 & Table 3)

## **Technical Notes**

The Local Market Survey measures the price and volume of selected agricultural produce from the Local Markets at Fugalei, Taufusi, Vaitele, Lotopa, Ululoloa, Afega, Saleimoa, Savaia, Vaoala, Faatoia and Salelologa every month. Prices for selected produce are taken from the Consumer Price Index.

\*\* Data shown reflects the average availability and prices of selected produce. This survey is conducted on each Thursday for rural markets on Upolu and Savaii and each Friday for urban markets on Upolu in the months under reference.

Weights for selected produce have been revised using 2014 as the base period and have been incorporated starting from June 2016 report.
